Courses to enrich your understanding and sharpen your skills

As a student in our social work program, you'll study society from a

variety of perspectives. You'll take psychology and sociology courses that will enhance your understanding of human behavior and the way society is organized. You'll take history and anthropology courses that will help you see life today in a new light. Of course, you'll also get a complete grounding in the theory and practice of social work. And you'll complement your coursework with internships and fieldwork that will give you invaluable real-world experience.

Here are just some of the courses you'll take when you major in social work:

- Introduction to Social Services for Children: Gain insights into the practice of working with children and on their behalf, with an emphasis on their developmental needs, along with a look at selected policy issues.
- **The Science of Social Issues:** Explore basic concepts in biology and physiology and their impact on social issues like substance abuse, mental illness, human sexuality and aging.
- **Social Work and Social Change:** Learn about social systems and policies in the United States and around the world—and how they empower or disenfranchise citizens.
